### A NOTE FROM PASTOR JANE

Dear Friends in Christ,

We have been talking a lot about working together through evangelism and community. With that in mind, I thought I would share the promises I made in my ordination. You may notice some similarities in the Sacrament of Baptism, Rite of Confirmation and Ordination services. In all three, we are reminded that promises are made.

When children are brought to be baptized, parents, sponsors, and the congregation are given responsibilities:

to live with them among God's faithful people, bring them to the word of God and the holy supper, teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in their hands the holy scriptures, and nurture them in faith and prayer, so that your children may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

At Confirmation, the same promises are made by each student.

You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

to live among God's faithful people,

to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,

to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,

to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

In ordination, the candidate is presented to the assembly and is then questioned.

## **Address and Questions**

The presiding minister addresses the candidate.

All baptized Christians are called to share in Christ's ministry of love and service in the world, to the glory of God and for the sake of the human family and the whole creation. According to apostolic usage you are now to be entrusted with the office of word and sacrament in the one holy catholic church by the laying on of hands and by prayer.

The presiding minister addresses questions to the candidate.

Before almighty God, to whom you must give account, and in the presence of this assembly, I ask: Will you assume this office, believing that the church's call is God's call to the ministry of word and sacrament?

Response: I will, and I ask God to help me.

The church in which you are to be ordained confesses that the holy scriptures are the word of God and are the norm of its faith and life. We accept, teach, and confess the Apostles', the Nicene, and the Athanasian Creeds. We also acknowledge the Lutheran confessions as true witnesses and faithful expositions of the holy scriptures. Will you therefore preach and teach in accordance with the holy scriptures and these creeds and confessions? [Note: do you see baptism here?]

Response: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Will you be diligent in your study of the holy scriptures and faithful in your use of the means of grace? Will you pray for God's people, nourish them with the word and sacraments, and lead them by your own example in faithful service and holy living? Response: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Will you give faithful witness in the world through word and deed, that God's love may be known in all that you do? [Note: proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.]
Response: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Almighty God, who has given you the will to do these things, graciously give you the strength and compassion to perform them. Amen.

There are prayers of intercession and thanksgiving, hymns, and a prayer for the candidate. I kneeled before God and (Former) Bishop John Anderson, along with other pastors laid hands on me and prayed,

Eternal God, through your Son, Jesus Christ, pour out your Holy Spirit upon Jane and fill her with the gifts of grace for the ministry of word and sacrament. Bless your servant's proclamation of your word and administration of your sacraments, so that your church may be gathered for praise and strengthened for service. Make Jane a faithful pastor, patient teacher, and wise counselor. Grant that in all things Jane may serve without reproach, that your people may be renewed and your name be glorified in the church; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

I was presented with a red stole by my family, and given a charge – my duty and responsibility as a pastor.

Charge

Jane Crawford, care for God's people, bear their burdens, and do not betray their confidence. So discipline yourself in life and teaching that you preserve the truth, giving no occasion for false security or illusory hope. Witness faithfully in word and deed to all people. Give and receive comfort as you serve within the church. And be of good courage, for God has called you, and your labor in the Lord is not in vain.

My point, dear friends, is that we're all in this together. I may be the pastor, but we all need each other.


